## CHOIR

### 1. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Achievements can only be awarded if the student has fulfilled the following criteria:

- Student has a good attitude, strong commitment to, full co-operation with and pleasing record of involvement in the choir
- 80% attendance at rehearsals (exceptions taken into consideration)
- Attends the two main Eisteddfods in the year (Floreamus Eisteddfod at Norkem Park and the Benoni Eisteddfod). Failure to perform will result in a lower award.
- 80% participation in unscheduled events in which the school may require the choir to participate and in any other scheduled choir competitions such as the Summies Festival, St. Dunstan’s Eisteddfod and the Ridgeview Retirement Village Fête.

### 2. AWARDS

Description of Award	Requirements
Certificate of Participation (Foundation Phase only)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Grade 2 students with two years participation (Grade 1 and Grade 2)</li> <li>• Grade 3 students with two years participation (Grade 1 and Grade 3, skipped Grade 2 OR Grade 2 and Grade 3)</li> </ul>
Certificate of Achievement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 2 Years of participation and fulfils the criteria above</li> <li>• Grade 7 students with 1-year participation may be eligible for an Achievement Certificate based on practice attendance and participation in Eisteddfods at the discretion of the colours’ committee.</li> </ul>
Certificate of Merit	3 Years of Participation and fulfils the criteria above
Half Colours	4 Years of participation and fulfils the criteria above
Full Colours	5 Years and fulfils the criteria above
Certificate of Exemplary Dedication	Students who have been part of the choir from Grade 1 to Grade 7

### 3. CONDITIONS FOR ACHIEVEMENT

- 3.1. Years of participation towards colours and awards will be taken into consideration from the student’s Grade 2 year.
- 3.2. Solo singing and duets will be awarded according to the Eisteddfod policy only.
- 3.3. All colours are awarded at the discretion of the Colours Committee.
