## PRE-SCHOOL (GRADES 0000 - R)

Ashton Pre-School focuses on the importance of early childhood development through the medium of work and play. The Grade R curriculum includes aspects of both National and Cambridge curricula in order to prepare our Ashlings for Grade 1.

## FOUNDATION PHASE (Grades 1 – 3)

Ashton is a school which measures itself against International standards. Our curriculum includes the International curriculum as from Grade one (Stage one) of the University of Cambridge. We are an accredited centre for the Cambridge International Primary checkpoint examination. As from Grade 3, Cambridge progression tests are provided.

## INTERMEDIATE PHASE (Grades 4 – 6)

As part of this phase, the students will participate in the Cambridge International Primary Checkpoint Examinations with an exit exam at Grade 6 level. Grade 6 is the last year of this phase. Students have different subjects and teachers. Homework is given and formal examinations written. They are guided to cope with more advanced academic work and greater independence. Percentages are given in reports. At the end of this Phase 6, they are ready for the Senior phase.

## SENIOR PHASE (Grade 7)

The academic aspect of schooling is more focused and students are given academic and study skills to maximise their potential for Higher Education.

## GRADE 8 / FORM 1 INTRODUCTION LEVEL

- Ten examinable subjects: English, Afrikaans, Mathematics, Physical Science, Biology, History, Geography, Accounting, Business Studies and Art & Design.
- Two CASS subjects: Computers and Life Orientation.
- At the end of Form 1 students select either South African Independent Examinations Board (IEB) or Cambridge Assessment International Examinations (CAIE) and seven subjects of their choice
- To qualify for Computer Science in Form 2, the student's Form 1 year average must be 70% + for Mathematics and 65%+ for English.

### CAMBRIDGE ASSESSMENT INTERNATIONAL EXAMINATIONS (CAIE)

#### FORM 2

Continue with seven examinable subjects in preparation for IGCSE examinations.

#### FORM 3

Continue with seven examinable subjects in preparation for IGCSE examinations at the end of Form 3.

Students may transfer to IEB at the end of this year. To continue with AS/ A Level students must obtain a minimum of 70% overall average at the end of Form 3 and all subjects must be written on the extended level.

#### FORM 4

Students select a minimum of five Advanced or a combination of Advanced Subsidiary and A Level subjects.

#### FORM 5

Continue with selected subjects in for AS/A examinations.

### INDEPENDENT EXAMINATIONS BOARD (IEB)

#### GRADE 9

Continue with seven examinable subjects in preparation for IEB examinations. One subject is dropped at the end of Grade 9 for Grade 10.

#### GRADE 10

Continue with seven examinable subjects in (including Life Orientation) in preparation for IEB examinations.

#### GRADE 11

Continue with seven examinable subjects (including LO) in preparation for IEB examinations.

#### GRADE 12

Continue with seven examinable subjects (including LO) in preparation for IEB examinations.

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
